Each week we will provide additional questions to expand conversation and help specify the content to various stages of life.

Connect (pick one to start)

1. Where have you seen the Lord at work in your life this Holiday season?
2. What is one lesson you have learned during this season?

Study (Read John 1:1-14)

1. What stands out to you most in this passage?
2. In verse 12, John says believers are given “the right to become children of God.” What do you think that means? (See 1 John 3:1–3.)
3. John describes Jesus as “full of grace and truth.” What does that mean to you?
4. How can we live out both grace and truth with one another and the world around us?
5. This passage says the light shines in the darkness and is not overcome. Is there a dark area of your life where you need Jesus’ light?

Reflect

1. Based on this conversation, is there anything you personally need to confess, consider, or surrender to God?
2. Is there any relationship or situation in your life that this story applies to?

Leader Notes

Jesus became human. This is one of the most profound and mysterious truths of our faith: Jesus is fully God and fully human. That means He understands our struggles and knows our pain. He did not love us from a distance, but chose to come near to save us. This radical love overcomes the darkness around us. Grace and truth are found in loving relationship; they do not work at a distance. Truth without love becomes condemnation. Grace without love becomes enabling. Grace and truth come together through genuine love and real relationship.
